





Description of	Fact-finding has started with the development of a			
implementation process	specific methodology and the following tools:			
	 Survey for staff of partner country universities (PCUs), Student survey, Literature review. 			
	Feedback from EU partners and respective stakeholders throughout the process ensured validity throughout the various development stages.			
	Tools have been piloted on a small sample (February 2017) and a broader fact-finding process has been launched in March 2017:			
	 At the end of March, data were available as follows: 35 responses from PCU staff of 4 universities on the PCU survey 184 responses from students of 4 universities on the student survey More than 70 entries to the literature review on Moodle from all partners in Armenia, BiH as well as from EU partners. 			
	During the training in June 2017, participants also jointly discussed key elements for benchmarking (to be applied every three years in order to measure progress in implementing the Social Dimension at the level of PCUs.)			
	Tools are expected to feed into a set of guidelines on how to develop/implement Social Dimension strategies for higher education in BiH and Armenia in line with the Bologna Process.


